The older I get the more often I get phone calls from secretaries to remind me of my medical appointments. However, when my cardiologist, my diabetic specialist, my dentist and others call me I wonder if these calls are for my benefit or theirs. Do they think "I am losing it" and need help to be reminded or are they afraid that *they* might be "losing" a valuable customer if I don't show up?

Have I ever missed appointments? Oh, yes! It has happened twice (so far): once in England and once in Canada. On both occasions I totally forgot to turn up for a preaching engagement. It was very embarrassing to me! I had no excuse for missing the engagements because they were listed in my dairy and calendar! But, somehow, they totally slipped my mind.

I once had a school friend who told me that it was necessary for him to make an appointment to speak with his father. I never understood that situation; I could talk with my father anytime, anywhere.

The word "appointment" sounds very official to me and I don't believe that it is suitable in the context of a family relationship. However, Scripture tells us about an appointment we all have. Hebrews 9 verses 27-28 says, "And just as it is appointed for man to die once, and after that comes judgement, so Christ having been offered once to bear the sins of many will appear a second time, not to deal with sin but to save those who are eagerly waiting for Him." This appointment date cannot be put in our dairy, we can just eagerly wait for it. At any time of any day we may have our Appointment with our Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ. And we will then be with Him forever!

Maybe this article is your reminder not to forget.

About two year ago I met a Filipino Captain, John Darilay, at the Lighthouse Fraser-Surrey Seafarers Centre. From that time forward we have remained in contact "electronically" and personally when he is in port. The Mission has supplied Capt. Since I struggle to pronounce his name properly, it takes a while for the seafarers to figure out who I am referring to. However, once they understand they all speak highly of John as a Christian. I have heard these comments about him: "He is a real Christian", "He has Bible studies on his ships", "I have been a Christian for a long time but it was in his Bible studies that the Bible came alive to me", and "He is a good man."

The Lord has new plans for John. Due to his company's mandatory retirement policy, when John's ship arrives in China within the next few weeks. He will retire. Therefore, this captain is looking for the Lord to lead him in his next step in life. The possibility of teaching at a seafarers' school and perhaps also instructing the students


