## Does God Give Up on People?

For many years my wife, Maria, and I felt greatly challenged when we would see a ship coming into port with the image of a hammer and sickle on its funnel. However, in response we went on a mission to meet the Russians aboard!

With much prayer and trembling and Russian Bibles in our briefcase, we climbed up the gangways of ships with Eastern European seafaring visitors aboard. Once aboard we were greeted with stern looks and unfriendly demands such as, "What do you want?"

After experiencing some of these visits we grew wiser and did not immediately disclose the purpose of our visit. Instead, we began to respond to the sharp inquiries about our reason for boarding the ships with equally stern looks and responses like, for example, "we want to see the commissar (the political party leader on the ship)". The men on the ship feared this man and, as a result, no further questions were asked. In fact, the next command we usually heard was, "Come."

Normally, the commissar was the man a person wanted to avoid but the Lord put it into our hearts to focus on this fellow. However, his response regarding our actual purpose was most often the same: "Not necessary." We could have easily become discouraged by this because it appeared that we were not having any success in our ministry. But, we continued to pray and go. As a result of our perseverance, many hundreds of Bibles were accepted and even more conversations about the Lord Jesus were held.

In the Bible Genesis 6:3 states: "My Spirit will not always strive with men." (KJV) There seems to be a time that God gives people over to sin (eg. Romans 1:24). But, we need to remember

that only God can see the heart of man and, for our part, we should never give up praying for the salvation of lost souls. When we feel discouraged because of the apparent lack of "success" in ministering to others, we can and should encourage each other in the Lord.

A few years after the fall of the Soviet Union we experienced some of the above mentioned encouragement. At a Harbour International Ministries seafaring conference an ex-commissar joined our fellowship. He had become a chaplain to seafarers in a former Soviet republic! This chaplain said to us: "As a commissar I was very harsh against you Christians coming to our ship again and again. But, God was merciful and opened my eyes to the Truth you shared with me."

God is so good!

#### **Victoria Crew Ministry News Update**

The following is a very recent point by point report from Chaplain Cecil Kleu regarding the status of this year's outreach to the crews of the passenger ships coming to Ogden Point in Victoria. We believe that it provides a very succinct summary of "where things are at." There seems to be much going on!

#### Cecil writes:

"Right now the (crew ministry) tent is empty and cold with a cool wind blowing. There is no sign of the warmth, friendship, encouragement and rich human interaction [that display] God's peace and grace when the tent is full of seafarers and ministry workers. There is little evidence of the life struggles, disappointments, and small victories experienced by hundreds of crew members as they connect with their families and friends from their home (away from home) in Victoria - The Lighthouse Crew Tent."

Much has been happening regarding the tent facility that is used for Ministry and crew communication. To provide you with an idea of the level of activity Cecil indicates:

"New routers [for wireless internet that seafarers use to contact loved ones] were installed; new chairs [for the tent] were installed; new carpet was laid [inside the tent]; ...[attendees of a men's prayer breakfast] helped clean, carpet and refurniture the tent; many donations of tea, coffee, cookies and toques were gratefully received; ... [a fellowship] provided a box of New Testaments to bridge the gap [until a new supply is received]."

In addition, the following comments were made:

"The new fresh water hose and tap work well; the PC is very fast, well used [and] now has sound often plays "Praise 106.5" [radio]; Valentine [a seafarer] checks in every week for Teus [Kappers] and has left a gift; Felitia's gift to the lady from Grenada is waiting; we are a bit like the post office tree for visiting ships; tea station is new; cof-

fee, tea, green tea is plentiful; cookies and Toques move fast; I have no words to explain the peace and friendship in the tent, other than to try to blame it on God's presence. Surely this tent belongs to Jesus! We now have a long list of volunteers and are ready to move to online scheduling. Tags are in use; please pray for the [Victoria Lighthouse Ministry] board meeting tonight; we could use another router and cisko wifi manager; Marcellino [Christian seafarer] and his fellowship from the Carnival Miracle [cruise ship] are planning "Praise in the Tent" on Jun 30 - we could use the loan of a guitar, drum and keyboard."

### **MS Regatta Visits North Vancouver**

It seems that each day of summer brings a new cruise ship into Vancouver's harbour. However, at LHM we do not normally have the opportunity to meet the crews of these ships because of, for example, security restrictions. Recently, however, the Lord opened a door for ministry to the crew of one of these ships.

At the beginning of June the MS Regatta was in drydock on Vancouver's North Shore. Conveniently situated within easy walking distance to the North Van Seamen's centre, the Regatta had a crew of about four hundred people from fourty different nationalities aboard. Its ten day stay in drydock provided Lighthouse workers, myself included, time to really get to know some of the regular visitors to the Centre.

The Regatta's crew members truly appreciated the service of the mission; particularly the free wifi. But many also wanted to share their experiences with us and, therefore, I was able to listen to these men and women talk about their lives; this was great. One Indian man, for example, sat down with me and showed me pictures of several places he had seen while working on board. He was proud to tell me about his faith, family and upcoming plans to be married.

On another occasion, a young Guatemalan lady told me that she had an English Bible but was having difficulties understanding the language. So, I offered her a Spanish Bible which she was pleased to receive. She also took a Jesus film DVD which she soon began to watch on board.

My time with the crew of the Regatta was a real blessing. I have already received emails from one of the ship's sailors and hope to hear from more of them. Lord willing, before their contracts end I also hope to visit with a few of them in Victoria when I serve with the Crews Ministry there.
