As part of my Dutch military service in 1969 I requested that I be attached to the military police and serve in Suriname (a former Dutch colony). For me, it would have meant a two year adventure away from home. I passed my medical and other tests and was liked because of my size (201 cm). (Actually, because men who were over 200 cm were rejected, I cheated a little by not standing straight when I was being measured (making myself 199 cm).)

I waited for my "number to come up" early in 1970. However, instead of being chosen for the military, I was informed by the Ministry of Defence that, as part of the "baby boomers," I and a few hundred other men were randomly excused from joining up. Unlike most men, I was disappointed because I had been looking forward to an adventure.

Although I did not know the Lord Jesus when my military service was excused, He knew me and had plans for my life. For, only a couple of weeks after that time I found myself watching a TV program with Billy Graham speaking and, after hearing the Gospel clearly presented, I was "hooked." The Lord Jesus Christ became my personal Saviour.

After coming to faith in the Lord, a life-long adventure began. Within a few months of my profession of faith I enrolled at the Bible College of Wales, visited with sailors for the first time onboard a ship and came to meet Maria, my wife for the past 42 years and counting. My original disappointment has turned out to become the greatest blessing I could ever have wished for or imagined.

God had already accounted for my memory loss as I found some of these in the crew tent! So just as

my friends were getting ready to return to the ship I quickly wrote notes in each of the New Testaments and signed them. The girls accepted them and said, "Wow, a New Testament. Thank you!" It was now time for them to leave so we went out to the dock behind the ship and Lizhao called me on my cell phone. We could see each other but only talk and wave to each other one last time. It was a sad moment but at the same time a very happy one because through this one friendship God

had brought the gospel to 4 others (two

from a previous visit).

I said goodbye to Yuan and Yun and then waved to Lizhao until he had to go back to work. I kept a close eye on the Rhapsody and when I saw the lines being released I went out to take some final pictures of her sailing away. To my delight Yuan was on the back deck. in her uniform, waving to me. The tears welled up in my eyes once again as the ship slowly moved out to sea.



The next day I received several emails from Lizhao saying how much our friendship had meant to him and how much God had blessed him

and his friends through Victoria Lighthouse Ministries. I have all of their email addresses so I will be maintaining contact with them wherever they are in the world. I will continue to follow-up with several of the crew since they have New Testaments that are tied to many wonderful memories of Victoria.

Tagalog New Testaments Needed
