Jer.29 v 11 "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

"I never wanted to be a seafarer!" These words came from a captain I met recently. It was hard to believe that they were said by a man who had reached the top of his field. I have met thou-

sands of ship captains in lifetime. my Some were humble. others were proud and arrogant and their crews suffered under their command. But the captain I met a short time ago was different; he re-

ally loved his crew and the men respected him. He was like a father to them. "So why did you go to sea?" I asked him. His answer surprised me: "My parents made me go," he said. "They needed a breadwinner for the family." He was the only male in the family who could help.

In some cultures parents have a big influence on their children's decision making. For example, a sailor once confided in me that he was not allowed to marry the girl he loved. Instead, he had to marry a girl of his parents' choosing and caste. So, I asked him: "Do you love the woman you married? His answer surprised me. "I learned to love her," he said.

My own father once asked me if I would trust him to find a wife for me. My answer was: "NO, NEV-ER." He then asked me, "Do you think I made a good choice with your mother?" (Best statement ever.)

At times, we must make choices. Some, however, are made for us and, from a Christian point of view, we can trust the ONE who has mapped out a path for our lives. Sixty years ago, if someone had asked me if I would trust God for my future life, likely I would also have said "No, never," because I didn't know the Lord

at that time. In hindsight, I could not have wished for a better life than the one I have had and the best is yet to come.

Do you trust the Lord, not only for salvation, but also for your path in life?

It was loud, busy and very disruptive and I thought that I would need to return to the ship in order to have a good conversation. However, all of a sudden things quieted and the CO turned his attention toward us. Wonderfully, this enabled us to share the Gospel with him. The Chief Engineer also joined us as we spoke of sin and the need for the Saviour that had been freely provided for us. *N* listened very well and I believe that he really understood the good news we shared. Please pray for N, whose family is safely out of the Ukraine, but has extended his contract because of the trouble there. He is also considering immigrating to Canada.
