I meet a variety of people as I visit crews. After a casual conversation I usually ask what they think happens after we die, or how can we be sure we'll be with God in heaven?

A Buddhist explained he hoped that his good deeds would be greater than his bad and therefore he'd go to heaven. He asked me how I would describe heaven. I had to think of a

simple answer and I said that for me, being with God would be heaven. I also gave him a New Testament and pointed to Revelation chapters 21 and 22. Please pray that he will find the Way to God through Jesus.

A Croatian officer says he believes in God but not the church, considering all the bad things the church has done over the centuries. He honours God and worships in his own way. I explained that the true church is the body of Christ (Ephesians 1 and 4) and we are connected by his Holy Spirit. Jesus explains that he is the true vine and we must remain in Him (John 15). Pray that he connects with Jesus the Head of the church and the true vine.

Mark, a Second Officer, took a New Testament and began reading at Mathew 1. He read two or three chapters as I waited and he remarked that Herod was not a very good man (was he?) and asked, "Who was King David?" Pray that Mark will continue to be drawn to the gospel and find lesus.

Sometimes I meet Christians who, when asked, immediately say that they have faith in Jesus. Jett is a born-again Christian and we shared our testimonies. His family was originally Roman Catholic but he attended a school where there was a Christian teacher. Her influence led him to

true faith in Christ. Subsequently his whole family became Christian including his heavily addicted father. He feels he wants to preach but doesn't have the confidence. His shipmates think the bible is boring. I showed him Acts 12 where God

rescues Peter from prison. No one can say that is boring! Please pray that God will give him the confidence to speak to his shipmates about the Saviour!




God Changes Our Plans


thanked me and left.


Christ our Lord. Love that will draw them to God. We love because He first loved us. And this love is the fulfillment of His commands to love God and our neighbour.

Before they went back to their ship, I prayed with him and encouraged him to come back to God. I told him to ask God to forgive him and restore is joy in serving Him. I encouraged him to read his Bible again and devote himself to pray that he will overcome and flee from temptations. He smiled at me and hugged me so tight that I had a hard time breathing. We parted ways and thanked God for touching the life of "A". Just like "A", many seafarers are struggling to cope with pressure and loneliness on board a ship. We need to listen and pray for them.
